Educational Problems

1. The absence of a coherent vision of education goals
2. A hierarchical organizational structure within the Ministry of Education
3. An outdated curriculum that focused on rote memorization
4. Lack of innovation in the classroom
5. No authority to make decisions at the school level

Needs

- Establishing a National Framework for Education
- Decentralization of Decision-Making
- Capacity-building for Education Planning and Management
- Renewal of Outdated Curricula and Textbooks
- Innovative, collaborative education to solve more complex problems

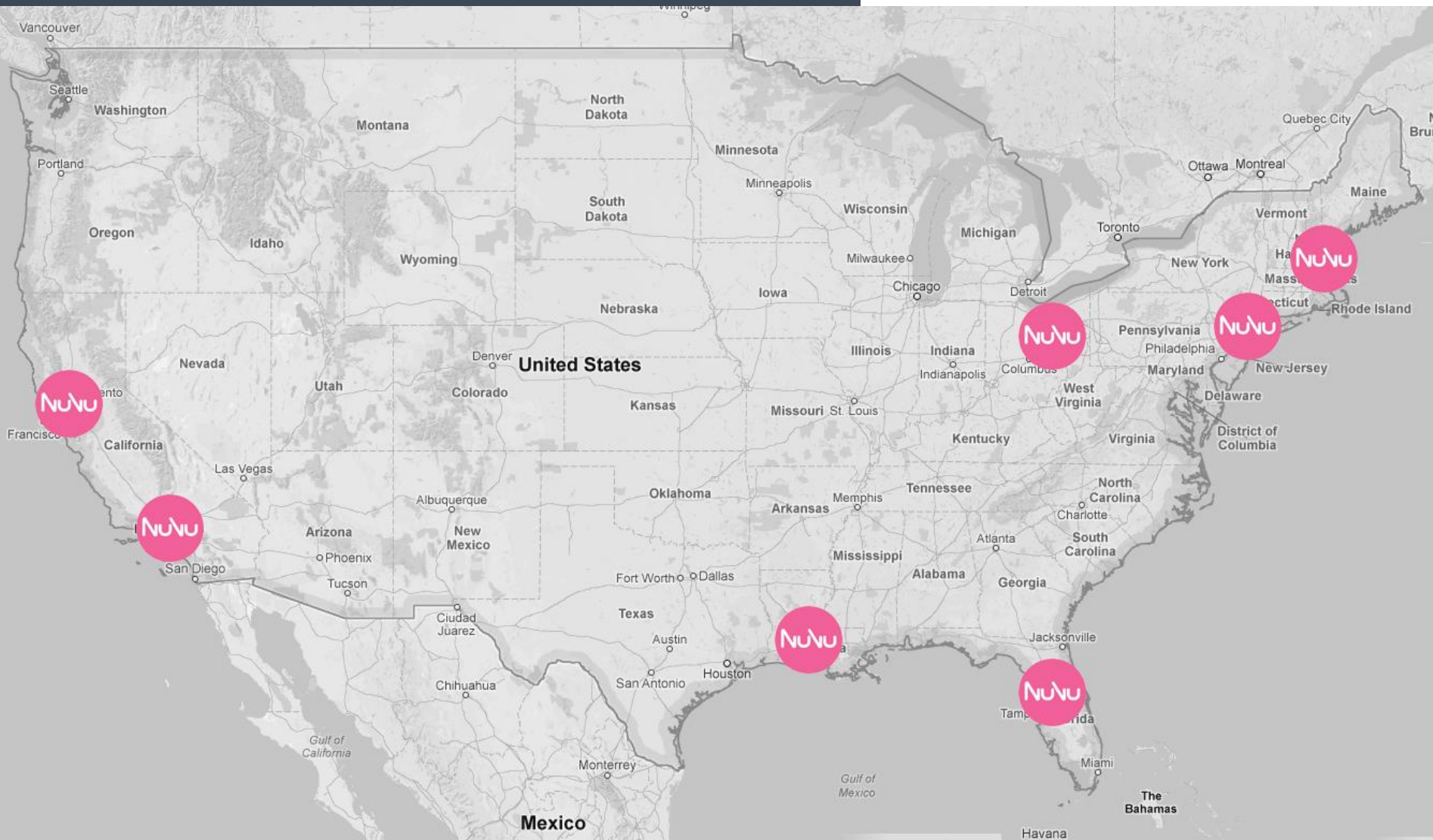
